About CTUAP

The Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh established in 2019, is a prominent Central University located in Kondakarakam, Vizianagaram, Andhra Pradesh. It was set up to fulfill the long-standing aspiration of the tribal communities for access to higher education. The University operates under the Central Universities Act, 2009, with jurisdiction extending across the state of Andhra Pradesh, and is fully funded by the Central Government through the University Grants Commission (UGC). CTUAP's permanent campus is currently under construction in Kuntinavalasa and Chinamedapalli Village, spread across the Mentada and Dattirajeru mandals of Vizianagaram.

CTUAP offers a wide range of programs including Undergraduate, Postgraduate etc., in regular mode. Admissions are conducted via the Central Universities Entrance Test (CUET), organized by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The university's academic structure is designed to provide quality education and cater to the diverse needs of its students, particularly from tribal background. The establishment of the permanent campus is expected to significantly enhance its infrastructure and academic environment.

The university is governed by a robust administrative framework with the President of India as its Visitor and a Chancellor serving as the ceremonial head. The Vice-Chancellor holds the executive powers, supported by administrative bodies like the Executive Council, Finance Committee, Academic Council, Board of Studies, and which oversee the smooth functioning and growth of the institution. The upcoming permanent campus will further the mission of the university in providing top-notch education and facilities for students.

CTUAP Conducts Sickle Cell Awareness Program in ASR District



Dr. Parikipandla Sridevi of the Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh conducted a comprehensive sickle cell disease awareness program in ASR district as part of the ICMR National Task Force major project titled "Sickle Cell Disease-related Stigma, Economic Loss and Quality of Life among the Tribal Population of India – ASR District, Andhra Pradesh." The program aimed to educate tribal communities about the medical, social, and economic aspects of sickle cell disease, addressing prevalent stigma and raising awareness on preventive care, early diagnosis, and management strategies. Through interactive sessions, community engagement, and informative discussions, the initiative highlighted the impact of sickle cell disease on quality of life while encouraging proactive health-seeking behaviour among the affected population. This awareness campaign forms a key component of the larger ICMR project, contributing to research, policy recommendations, and community interventions to reduce disease burden and improve the well-being of tribal populations in the region.





Seminars, Workshops, Talks, etc.

National Seminar on Tribal Knowledge and Inclusiveness



The Department of Social Work, Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh in collaboration with the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi, organized a two-day National Seminar on “Reconciliation and Inclusiveness of the Tribal Knowledge System” on 29 and 30 August 2025. The seminar aimed to explore the depth and diversity of indigenous knowledge among tribal communities and its significance in sustainable development, cultural preservation, and social transformation. Padma Shri Cheruvayal Raman from Kerala graced the inaugural session as the Chief Guest, while Dr. Seetha Kakkoth from Kannur University attended as the Guest of Honour. The event was also attended by Prof. Jitendra Mohan Mishra, Registrar (I/c), Prof. M. Sharatchandra Babu, Dean, School of Social Sciences and Humanities, and Dr. Nagesh M, Convener and Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work. Their collective insights emphasized the importance of integrating traditional wisdom with contemporary knowledge systems to achieve holistic development.

On the second day, Dr. Santhosh Naik R from Karnataka State Open University, Mysuru, and representatives from an NGO based in Araku contributed to the technical sessions, sharing grassroots experiences and innovative practices. The valedictory session was graced by Dr. P. Sankar Rao, Director and Curator, Tribal Research and Training Institute (TR&TI), Government of Andhra Pradesh, Visakhapatnam. The seminar brought together faculty, research scholars, and students from across India, fostering a vibrant dialogue between academia and community practitioners. Workshop on Sexual Harassment and Women’s Safety

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) of the Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh organized a workshop titled “Creating Safe Campus: Awareness on Sexual Harassment and Women’s Safety” on 17



September 2025 at the university’s Transit Campus. The program aimed to sensitize students and staff about sexual harassment, women’s safety, and the pivotal role of the ICC in fostering a secure academic environment. The workshop was graced by Smt. P. Soumya Latha, Additional Superintendent of Police (Admin.), Vizianagaram, as the chief guest. An interactive session allowed participants to raise queries, and demonstration videos illustrated practical use of the Shakti App. The Presidential Address by Prof. T. Srinivasan, Vice-Chancellor (I/c), reaffirmed CTUAP’s commitment to creating a safe, inclusive, and gender-sensitive academic environment. The Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh successfully conducted a one-day training workshop on “Rashtriya Karmayogi” on 25 September 2025, aimed at the professional development of both teaching and non-teaching staff. MoU Signed Between ICAR–IIRR Hyderabad and CTUAP for Sustainable Tribal Development



In a significant step toward empowering tribal communities through agricultural innovation, the ICAR–Indian Institute of Rice Research (IIRR), Hyderabad, and the Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh (CTUAP) signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to foster academic and research collaboration for sustainable tribal development. The agreement was formalized under the leadership of Dr. R. M. Sundaram, Director, IIRR, and Prof. T. Srinivasan, Vice-Chancellor (I/c), CTUAP. The signing ceremony witnessed the presence of senior scientists from IIRR, Dr. C. N. Neeraja, Dr. Amtul Waris, Dr. A. P. Padmakumari, Dr. B. Sreedevi, and Dr. Papa Rao Vaikuntapu — along with Dr. Anirudh Kumar, Associate Professor, CTUAP. The MoU was signed by Prof. Srinivasan on behalf of CTUAP and Dr. Sundaram on behalf of IIRR, with Dr. Kumar (CTUAP) and Dr. Neeraja (IIRR) acting as Nodal Officers and witnesses.

The collaboration outlines a comprehensive roadmap to promote organic rice farming, introduce Iron- and Zinc-rich biofortified rice to combat anaemia, and adopt low Glycaemic Index (GI) rice to address Type-2 Diabetes prevalent in tribal populations. It also emphasizes capacity-building programs for tribal farmers through training in modern rice technologies, soil health testing, pest and disease management, and the use of eco-friendly pest control tools such as pheromone traps. Under the agreement, CTUAP will be recognized as a Voluntary Centre under the All India Coordinated Rice Improvement Project (AICRIP), facilitating joint research and development activities. The partnership further includes initiatives under the Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) to enhance livelihoods, alongside provisions for student training, collaborative projects, and buy-back mechanisms for biofortified rice. Both institutions expressed satisfaction over this landmark collaboration and reaffirmed their commitment to aligning agricultural research with tribal welfare to achieve nutritional security, sustainable farming, and socio-economic upliftment in tribal regions.

This MoU marks the beginning of a long-term partnership aimed at integrating scientific research with indigenous knowledge systems. It is expected to serve as a model for other institutions working toward inclusive and sustainable rural development in India.

CTUAP Signs Landmark MoU for Collaborative Tribal Research



The Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh, Vizianagaram, joined hands with four other central universities in signing a landmark Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to promote collaborative research and academic initiatives in Tribal Studies. The MoU was formalized at the Central University of Odisha (CUO), Koraput, in the presence of representatives from English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU), Hyderabad, Indira Gandhi National Tribal University (IGNTU), Amarkantak, Samakka Sarakka Central Tribal University (SSCTU), Mulugu, and CTUAP, Vizianagaram.

Prof. T. Srinivasan, Vice-Chancellor (I/c), CTUAP, represented the University at the event. Speaking on the occasion, he described it as a momentous step toward strengthening inter-university collaboration in tribal education and research. He expressed hope that this initiative would encourage a shift from merely “educating the tribals” to “learning from the tribals,” thereby promoting reciprocal knowledge exchange and deeper cultural understanding. The MoU, conceived as part of the vision encouraged by the Hon’ble Minister of Education, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, aims to facilitate joint research projects, faculty and student exchanges, and shared academic resources among the participating institutions. The agreement marks a significant milestone in CTUAP’s commitment to advancing tribal welfare, community-based research, and the objectives of the National Education Policy 2020, through meaningful academic collaboration and field engagement.

World Sickle Cell Day with Awareness Campaign

The Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh observed World Sickle Cell Day on June 19, 2025, with a series of awareness initiatives aimed at educating tribal communities about Sickle Cell Disease (SCD). Admission Process at CTUAP

The admission process at the Central Tribal University of Andhra Pradesh is primarily based on the scores obtained in the Central University Entrance Test (CUET) for the respective programmes. If any seats remain vacant after CUET-based admissions, they will be filled through a university-conducted entrance test.
